They have and still are building sophisticated equipment for the Military, Commercial and the Space market at various divisions within the parent corporation.

CMI has set up the new Signal/One Corporation at 1645 West 135th Street, Gardena, Calif. 90249 where the new CX7A's are manufactured. All modifications and service work will also be performed here. People working in the service and final test areas, besides being a top notch technician, are required to hold an advanced or higher amateur class license. CMI feels you have to be a ham with pride in his work in order to know when a piece of ham equipment is operating properly.

CMI has great plans for the future of Signal/One. After they thoroughly analyzed the Signal/One CX7 and corrected all the causes of the many serious problems, they realized they had truly the finest radio of today. In order to differentiate it from the old, they decided to designate it as the CX7A. It will include all of the CMI mods plus all the latest ECI circuitry at no change in the \$2195.00 price. The CX7A presently in the field with time meters attached have logged as many as 2000 trouble free hours of operation. This is equivalent to 66 weeks or nearly a year and a half of normal ham operation! The reason for this reliability is because one of the mods eliminated the big bug - the transient which heretofore was killing the solid state circuitry.

CMI is so enthusiastic at the success they have derived from these mods that they are recommending present CX7 users to have the changes incorporated into their boxes at the low cost of \$69.50. The reliability mod is but one in the mod package. The others vastly enhance the overall operation giving the unit a "new sound".
